<u>MUSIC NOTES</u> – Louis Vierne was organist at the Cathedral of Nôtre-Dame in Paris. Among his many organ compositions were many, such as the *Communion* which were meant for specific parts of the Mass. While J. S. Bach is the ascribed composer of today's postlude, the music may, in fact, have been written by his star composition pupil, Ludwig Krebs: both manuscript and copied versions of this piece are ambiguous in definitively assigning the work to one or the other men. Nevertheless, it stands as a little gem of late Baroque music in its clarity and economy of style.


