MUSIC NOTES: Today’s offertory anthem is a setting of an old German text which has been used by many composers in settings which range from simple to elaborate. Its most distinguishing feature is its coupling of Easter with spring. The text is: *The whole bright world rejoices now / The birds do sing on every bough / Then sing beneath the racing skies / To Him that rose that we might rise / And all things living make praise / He guideth you on all your ways / He, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost / Our God most high, our joy, and boast.*

William Boyce was an Englishman who wrote for organ as well as for many other instruments. His *Trumpet voluntary* begins with a soft introduction which is followed by a quicker piece for the organ’s trumpet stop. Bach has set the German Easter hymn *Christ lay in death’s dark prison* rather simply: the hymn tune is in the topmost voice of the piece while the lower voices embroider a texture which is, through its constant movement, propels the tune ever forward.

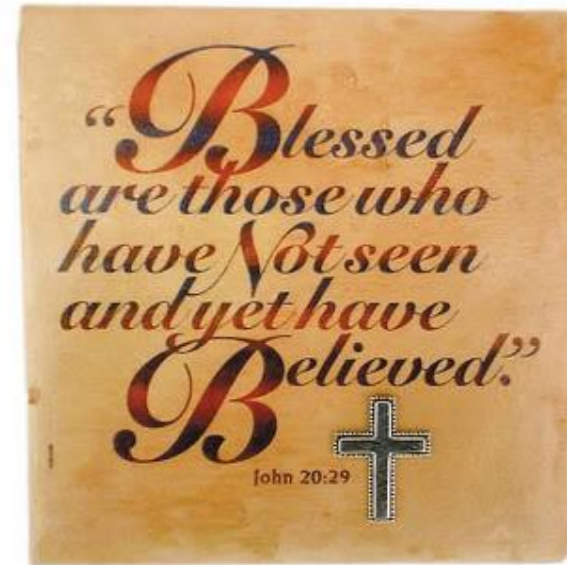
