<u>MUSIC NOTES</u> – Eric Thiman (1900-75) was a British organist, composer, and pedagogue. He served on the faculties of the Royal Academy of Music and the University of London and was organist at City Temple in London. He was a prolific composer of music for piano, organ, instruments, solo voice, and choir, and he was especially interested in fostering music-making by amateur musicians. His *Aeolian pavane* is based on a Renaissance dance form and he limits himself to the 'aeolian mode' which was a musical pattern believed to be used by the ancient Greeks. His *Postlude* is in a more traditional style.
