

MUSIC NOTES – **MUSIC NOTES:** George Frideric Handel (1685-1759) was born in Germany and trained in both Germany and Italy before emigrating to Great Britain in 1712 where he spent the rest of his creative life. He was well known for his church music, oratorios, orchestral music, and most of all for his operas. He founded three opera companies while he was in London though after great success with his oratorio *Messiah* in 1742 he never performed another opera. He died a wealthy and famous man and was given a state funeral with over 3,000 people in attendance and was buried in Westminster Abbey. Today we sample three works for different media: his *Fugue in C* is an example of his keyboard music (of which, given that he was an accomplished keyboard player, there is not much besides his sixteen organ concertos), while the solo *Gentle redeemer* is an example of his gift for lyric melody. The *Hornpipe* is a transcription for organ of a movement from his orchestral music written in 1717 known as the *Water Music* since it was performed for King George by about 50 musicians who were stationed on a barge in the Thames.

PRESBYTERAL ORDINATION – **Deacon Donald Wunderlich** of Easton, PA will be ordained a Polish National Catholic Church priest on **Saturday, August 27, 2016 at Saint Stanislaus Bishop and Martyr Cathedral, Scranton**. The ordination **Mass will be held at 10 am** with the Right Reverend Bernard Nowicki, DD, Bishop Ordinary of the Central Diocese, PNCC officiating. Diocesan and Cathedral choir members, Diocesan as well as Cathedral ANS members, area clergy and Cathedral parishioners are invited to participate in and witness this grace-filled event in the life of our Diocese.

Deacon Wunderlich was baptized into the life and death of Jesus Christ at the Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish in Homestead, Pennsylvania, near Pittsburgh. His parents influenced his early spiritual development in the Church and encouraged him and his brothers to serve as acolytes for many years. He assisted the future Bishop Bernard Nowicki, pastor at the time, with whom he remained friends ever since.

Deacon Wunderlich was ordained a Sub-deacon by Bishop Peplowski, Ordinary of the Buffalo-Pittsburgh Diocese in May, 2000. Subsequently, Deacon moved to New Jersey where he continued his studies with Father Bernard Nowicki. He then worshiped and studied at Saint Joseph's Parish in Florida under Very Reverend Paul Sobiechowski, now the Ordinary of the Eastern Diocese, PNCC.

In August, 2013 Donald Wunderlich was ordained as a Deacon by Bishop Bernard Nowicki at the Holy Mother of Sorrows Parish in Dupont, Pennsylvania. Immediately afterward, Deacon Wunderlich started his ministry of service in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Deacon Donald

Wunderlich was assigned by Bishop Nowicki to pastor the faithful of Our Savior's Parish in Lawrenceville, NJ in 2014. His first Mass as a priest will be celebrated at Our Saviour PNC Parish in Lawrenceville, New Jersey at 3 pm on Sunday, August 28, 2016.

CONCERT – Our Cathedral will host a concert in the Youth Center given by the acclaimed **Serbian accordionist, Petar Maric on Tuesday evening at 7:00, September 13th**. The concert is free and open to the public. A freewill offering will be accepted. Born in Belgrade, Serbia in 1990, Petar Maric was introduced to the accordion at the age of five. He is the winner of numerous musical and cultural awards including four world champion titles in international accordion competitions. Mr. Maric specializes in classical music as well as eclectic variety compositions and is a pioneer in the performance of electronic accordion music. Mr. Maric's extraordinary talent, musicality and domination on stage have made him heard and remembered throughout Europe, the orient and Pacific Rim nations.
