MUSIC NOTES – Throughout the history of music, music has borrowed titles as well as form from literature. This morning's prelude and postlude are examples. An elegy, in literature, is a mournful or plaintive poem especially in commemoration of the dead. Parry wrote his *Elegy* for the funeral of his brother-in-law, though this morning is it in memory of those who perished in the events of 9/11. In it you will hear allusions to a funeral march as well as the inclusion of a stoic melody on a solo sound. An epilogue is the concluding portion of a novel or a play. Norman Gilbert uses this idea of conclusion to write what would otherwise, in musical and liturgical terms, be known as a postlude.
