MUSIC NOTES – A *ciacona* or *chaconne* was a musical form introduced to Spanish culture in the late 16th century from the New World (most likely what is now South America). It was originally a voluptuous dance in triple time sometimes coupled with mocking lyrics. In its more ‘tame’ structure it became a vehicle for variations played over a repeating short bass line. In Buxtehude’s example the repeated bass line is seven notes long and is played by the pedals while the manuals (keyboard) weave about 30 variations of increasing complexity and virtuosity. The *Fantasia* is, as its name implies, a work of a composer’s fantasy in the sense of free invention. Fantasias range from those which are strict in their structure to those which are completely free (like a jazz improvisation). Bach’s *Fantasia in* is somewhere between the two extremes. A hymn-like texture is propelled by movement in the pedals and the inner voices of the composition.
