Bishop Bernard will be at St. Mary’s Duryea, for its 115th Parish Anniversary

NASHOTAH HOUSE CONFERRAL – On October 24th Bishop Bernard will attend the annual Academic Convocation of Nashotah House, an Anglo-Catholic Seminary in Nashotah, Wisconsin outside Milwaukee. The main address of the Convocation will be delivered by the Rt. Rev. Michael E. Marshall, eighth Bishop of Woolwich, who will speak on the topic: Divorce and Remarriage: Putting Theology and Spirituality Back Together Again. At this gathering Bishop Bernard, together with three other individuals, will be the recipient of a Doctor of Divinity degree *in honoris causa*. Earlier in his ministry as a Polish National Catholic priest, Bishop Bernard studied theology at Nashotah House, having been preceded there by other PNCC clergy both for study and for the conferral of the same honorary doctorate degree in divinity. Therefore, Bishop Bernard, along with some other of our Church’s clergy, bears the designation of ‘a son of the House’ for having studied there. Preliminary discussions are currently under way to explore mutually beneficial academic collaborations between Nashotah House and the Polish National Catholic Church.
