**MUSIC NOTES** – Henry Purcell (1659-95), who composed today’s anthem and postlude, began his musical studies as a chorister at the Chapel Royal in London. He began composing at an early age and by 1679 had become organist at Westminster Abbey as well as at the Chapel Royal in 1682. Purcell composed choral music for the church as well as much music for opera and theatrical productions. He died at the height of his career and was revered as a composer whose influence persisted even into 20<sup>th</sup> century English music. Johann Gottfried Walther’s (1684-1748) setting of *Praise to the Lord* shows his contrapuntal genius in a nutshell. Each phrase of the hymn tune is heard clearly in the pedals but each phrase of the hymn tune is pre-figured, or alluded to, by the keyboard part before it is stated in the pedals. Thus, for the opening phrase of the hymn the keyboard weaves the first few notes of the hymn into a texture which then becomes the backdrop for the bold statement of the hymn itself. Walther follows this procedure for each phrase of the hymn.
