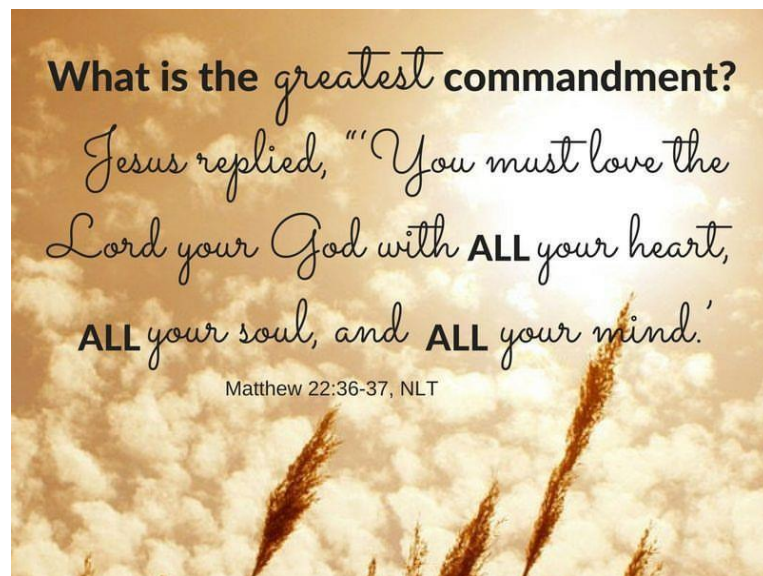

MUSIC NOTES – Jean-Yves Daniel-Lesur (1908-2002) was a French organist, teacher, and composer. His composition *In paradisum* is fitting for All Soul's Day: as its main theme it uses the opening phrase of the Latin hymn which was used at the end of the Roman Catholic funeral Mass. The chant theme is followed by a section marked *tristement* (sadly) which evokes human grief. A restatement of the opening chant theme returns to a feeling of tranquility while the very ending – which is a series of chords ending high on the organ's softest stop – seems to convey the soul's ascent to heaven. *The Latin hymn is translated as: May the angels lead you into paradise. May the martyrs receive you In your coming. And may they guide you Into the holy city, Jerusalem. May the chorus of angels receive you, And with Lazarus, once poor, May you have eternal rest.* Lesbia Scott, who was British, included *I sing a song of the saints of God* in a collection of poems and hymns originally written for her children which was published in 1929. The tune was added to it in 1940 by the New Englander John H. Hopkins and has become a very popular American hymn.
