

PARISH MEETING – There will be a Special Parish Meeting to vote on borrowing from the Endowment Fund on **Sunday, December 4, 2016 following 9:30 a.m. Mass.**

MUSIC NOTES – Marcel Dupré (1886-1971) was an organist, composer, and teacher. He played over 2000 recitals in the USA, Europe, Canada, and Australia and made many recordings. He was sought out as a teacher not only of Europeans but also of American organists (four of my five organ teachers studied with him). His pedagogical activities also included his publication of an organ-playing method, an instruction book on improvisation, and his editing of the complete works of Bach, among other composers. His own compositional style fused the historical with the modern and he brought organ music into the 20th century with his harmonic language. His *Vêpres du commun* (*Communion vespers*) is a series of fifteen pieces in various styles appropriate for church services. *Antiphon III* consists of a slow, languid, melody punctuated by low notes in the pedals while *Antiphon V* is based on a melody which is constantly ascending in nature.
