At the beginning of your forty-day Lenten journey, you were marked with ashes in the Sign of the Cross, that stark reminder that you are going to

die. Now, at the Easter celebrations, those ashes are washed off because you're "soaked" with that same Easter water we use to join new souls to Christ in baptism and bring them into the church. Death no longer has a

claim on you. I've reminded you before, and I repeat it now: it's God who has the last word - and God's word for you is the same as His word for his only-begotten Son and your Savior Jesus. It's "live!" Live! Yes, live in him!

You live! You live in him now and forever! After all, that's why you and I "pull out all the stops" at Easter. In Jesus' resurrection, God's life triumphs over death. At your Easter worship, your senses are ravished with beauty and sounds and fragrances as at no other time of the Church year all because he has resurrected from the dead and lives. And because he lives, you live. Life eternal has already begun for you! You live with him now and forever as you share in his resurrection through your faith.

Jesus suffered and died and resurrected precisely "that you may have life and have it more abundantly." So behold his life and resurrection around you and in you. When the gospel is preached to you and the Eucharist received, there is the resurrection and the life.

When you participate in the ministries of your parish and Church or establish new ministries

within it, there is resurrection and life.

When those with different abilities and backgrounds and circumstances experience home and love from you and other parishioners, there is resurrection and life.

When you encourage young adults in your parish to discover their calling through faith, and they do, there is resurrection and life.


When a young person deepens his/her faith in Christ through the youth convocation or other such gatherings, there is resurrection and life.

When you and your friends journey to the men's spiritual retreat and to the women's spiritual programs of our Church, there is resurrection and life.

When you let go of your prejudice, there is resurrection and life.


When children have passed through the storms of abuse and abandonment and finally experience sanctuary, there is resurrection and life.

Eve and John have decided to join St. Stanislaus and have their newest member to their family, Madelyn Eve baptized at the end of March. (See Another Baby is Splashed)


John, Eve, and Michael were officially accepted as members of St. Stanislaus at the Feb-

The Prayer Shawl & Blanket Ministry






