

Mass of Chrism this Tuesday, March 26th at 4:00 pm — The Chrism Mass gathers the diocese around its bishop before the beginning of the Triduum, the three most solemn days preceding Easter, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. On their departure, the priests take home the holy oils and sacred chrism needed for various sacraments throughout the coming year.

The Liturgy of this Mass celebrates the dignity of all those who have been made Christ's disciples through baptism and anointing. For this exceptional and holy moment, everyone is gathered jointly in unity, i.e. the people together with their priests around their bishop for the consecration of the chrism. Everyone is reminded by such a gathering as this, that no one ever responds to this liturgical call alone or on one's own. Our oneness in Christ through baptism and its holy anointings is manifested in the Liturgy of this Mass

The Chrism Mass uniquely gives attention to the ordained figures of the Diocese as they renew their priestly promises within the liturgy. It is the ordained priesthood that serves all who have been baptized in order that they would be strengthened, sanctified and instructed.

Tenebrae – Good Friday, 7 pm – Tenebrae is a liturgical service of Psalms along with the Lamentation of the Polish National Catholic Church offered by men of the Cathedral Parish together with the clergy. It features distinctive symbolic elements of Christ's passion and death. *Tenebrae* means "shadows" or "darkness" in Latin. The service shows the darkness that comes over the earth upon Christ's death. During the course of this service of Good Friday, candles are gradually extinguished, and a loud noise, called a "strepitus" at one point in the service symbolizes the chaos following Christ's death. Historically, Tenebrae was a portion of the Liturgy of the Hours prayers of Matins and Lauds for Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of Holy Week. Now, it is an adaptation or shortened form of those prayers which are typically offered in the center of the Triduum, *i.e.*, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday. We offer this service, Tenebrae, as a potent and reflective experience for the faithful. The representation of the darkness of sin and death serves to call the faithful to embrace the light of Christ, who has conquered death.
