<u>Pentecost</u> – (also called **Whitsunday**) is a Solemnity which takes place on the 50th day after Easter Sunday. This Solemnity commemorates the descent of the <u>Holy Spirit</u> upon the weak and cowering disciples of Jesus who, from that moment, would be the empowered and courageous Apostles of Jesus, preaching the Good News, advancing the plan of God for his people's salvation and bringing hearers of their message into The Way and into Christ's Church. Mary, the Mother of Jesus, was present among them on this occasion as recorded in the Acts of the Apostles 1:14. As faithful and observant Jews, the Jesus' disciples together with Mary were gathered to celebrate the Jewish wheat harvest of Shavuot, known as the Feast of Weeks.

Our celebration of this significant event in the lives of Jeus followers at the time and his Mother and, indeed, in all of Christianity, marks the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and other disciples, fulfilling Jesus' promise to send the Holy Spirit, empowering the apostles and all believers to be witnesses of his message. This event is seen to be the "birth of the church" as it empowered believers to proclaim the gospel and launch the Christian mission.

Wearing red on Pentecost Sunday is a symbolic act that represents the fire of the Holy Spirit and the spiritual, internal transformation it brings within a believer.

Our solemnizing Pentecost on this day each year acknowledges God's ability to communicate with and work through his people of all nations, empowering them to spread his message throughout the world.
